Our Story began in the 1920's with my father, Carl Kann.





Dad passed away about the time the internet was developing. He could not have imagined its impact today. But he had good taste and knew what "quality" was all about.



I always had a pretty good camera, because I was taking pictures of merchandise and Dad in the store. It was a family affair.





The skeleton watch is a piece of artwork.








Some of the first merchandise Mom found was this set of dishes for 4 persons (4 cups and saucers, 4 plates and 4 sauce dishes).

Because of our years of study and direction we have become as much a caretaker museum as a host of quality selections.










We found the animals of Africa hand carved in the countryside and we discovered how really precious wood was becoming.


Thomas Mosser began working with glass as a teenager under the guidance of his father. It was a bottom to top education.

The Icy Acrylics are gorgeous. They come alive with the small LED lights that are used inside.






